County is a vital player in a bi-state metropolitan area with a growing economy, an exemplary education system and access to high-quality health care, housing, transportation, parks and many other amenities.



If you are an experienced Public Works professional looking to join a team of dedicated employees to provide excellent services in one of the most beautiful areas in the pacific northwest, this is the right position for you!

THE COMMUNITY

As a regional hub for transportation and commerce, Clark County is across the Columbia River from Portland, Oregon, and the Portland International Airport. Clark County is the fifth most populous county in Washington with more than 481,950 residents and encompasses more than 656 square miles. Clark County's seat and largest city is Vancouver, which is the fourth largest city in Washington and boasts a vibrant downtown and a thriving restaurant and brewery scene.





Clark County offers a high quality of life with low property taxes, affordable housing, high-performing schools and convenient access to outstanding cultural and recreational amenities. Interstates 5 and 205 provide access to major economic centers in Washington and Oregon.

With more than 40 miles of frontage on the Columbia River, the county offers a mix of urban areas, small towns, parks, farms, forests and wildlife refuges. With a mild year-round climate, the region is the perfect place to take advantage of outdoor recreational activities, including fishing, hunting, swimming, boating, camping, hiking and skiing. The county has easy access to the Pacific Coast, only 90 miles to the west, and the Cascade Mountains, including Mount Hood and Mount St. Helens, each less than a two-hour drive away. Clark County is also home to the Fort Vancouver National Site, a 366-acre historic reserve that Congress created in 1996. The site is owned and managed by the National Park Service and the city of Vancouver.

The county is served by nine school districts, with enrollments ranging from fewer than 200 students to more than 26,000 students. Several districts host programs for home schooling and the trades. Clark College and Washington State University Vancouver, the only four-year university in Southwest Washington, are both located in Clark County.

THE COUNTY

Founded in 1845, Clark County is governed by the five-member Clark County Council, with five councilors elected at the district level and the council chair selected by the councilors at the beginning of each year. The county council is responsible for constituent inquiries, adopting the biennial budget, developing and implementing planning and zoning policies, adopting ordinances, and making citizen appointments to some advisory committees and boards, while the county manager oversees the day-to-day operations of administrative departments.

County departments include: assessor, auditor, board of equalization, budget, children's justice center, community development, community planning, community services, county clerk, county council, county manager, courts, district court, elections, general services, geographic information systems, human resources, juvenile court, medical examiner, prosecuting attorney, public health, public works, sheriff, superior court, and treasurer. Clark County adopted a 2022 General Fund budget of \$321,324,822 and a countywide budget of \$891,104,400. The county employs approximately 1,700 full-time equivalent employees.



THE DEPARTMENT

The Clark County Public Works Department employs more than 300 employees and provides services primarily to 225,000 residents who live in unincorporated areas outside city boundaries. The department is currently divided into six divisions: Administration & Finance, Clean Water, Engineering & Construction, Parks & Lands, Road Maintenance & Safety, and Transportation & Development. These divisions work closely together and sometimes with other county departments and outside agencies to provide services and build projects for the public. Each division has a manager who reports to Public Works Director/County Engineer.

THE POSITION

This position coordinates multiple project teams of designers, real property professionals, surveyors, traffic engineers, permitting personnel and other essential people to deliver on complex and rewarding capital projects for the county. The position will be responsible for delivery of capital proiects in Public Works including Transportation, Parks, Clean Water, Bridges, Pavement Preservation, and the County Railroad. The position reports to the PM Section Manager and works collaboratively with sections throughout Public Works and other county departments. It will also work closely with state and federal agencies, utility service providers, and businesses in coordinating project activities, along with working directly with the public and neighborhood associations.

Clark County is looking to fill this position as a Capital Project Manager III; however, this position could be under-filled as a Capital Project Manager II. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. This position is in the Local 17 Engineers 214 Union, and flexible teleworking and/or hybrid work arrangements are currently available for this position.

IDEAL CANDIDATE

Capital Project Manager III Minimum Education and Experience:

- A Bachelor's degree in project management, civil engineering, or a related field; and five (5) years of project management or closely related experience at the Capital Project Manager II level.
- Experience emphasizing construction-based transportation projects is highly desirable: <u>OR</u> Seven (7) years of responsible project management experience or closely related experience at the Capital Project Manager II level that demonstrates the knowledge, skills, and ability to perform the work described above.
- Certification as a Project Management Professional (PMP).
- Licensure as a Professional Engineer in Civil or Environmental Engineering will qualify for consideration, while candidates work toward and achieve PMP certification within two (2) years of receiving Capital Project Manager III classification.

Capital Project Manager II Minimum Education and **Experience**:

- A Bachelor's degree in project management, civil engineering or a related field; and two (2) years of responsible project management or closely related experience at the Capital Project Manager 1 level. Experience emphasizing construction-based transportation projects is highly desirable.
- In lieu of the above requirement, candidates may have five (5) years of responsible project management experience or closely related experience at the Capital Project Manager 1 level that demonstrates the knowledge, skills, and ability to perform the work described above.
