THE COMMUNITY

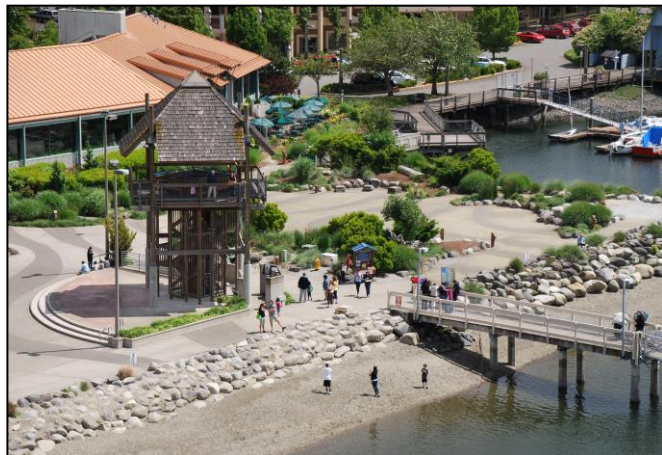


Nature is at your doorstep in Olympia. With fresh and salt-water shorelines and nearby timbered forests, Olympia offers convenient access to water sports, hiking, and outdoor recreation. The City is routinely recognized for its outstanding quality of life, vibrant downtown, convenient walking and biking, active/engaged community, low crime rate, and family friendly amenities. Olympia, the Capital City, is also the entertainment, arts and cultural hub for the Thurston County area and beyond.

Olympia is also within easy driving distance of major national parks, Pacific Ocean, Cascade and Olympic Mountains, and urban centers of Seattle WA, Portland OR, and Vancouver BC.

THE CITY

The City of Olympia operates under a Council-Manager form of government. The seven City Council members are elected to four-year staggered terms. City Council consists of an elected Mayor, an appointed Mayor Pro Tem, and five remaining members. Appointed by the City Council, the City Manager administers the City's day-to-day operations. The City of Olympia provides a full range of municipal services with a preliminary 2023 Operating Budget of \$185.0 million. City departments include the City Manager's Office, Community Planning & Development, Finance, Fire, Legal, Parks, Arts, & Recreation, Police, and Public Works.



THE DEPARTMENT & DIVISION

The Public Works Department functions with 178 FTEs and an overall budget of approximately \$82 million. The Department is divided into six divisions, which include Engineering, General Services, Waste Resources, Transportation, Drinking Water Utility, and Water Resources (made up of the Storm & Surface Water Utility and Wastewater Utility).

The Drinking Water Utility provides the public with safe and sustainable drinking water and reclaimed water. It ensures a sufficient drinking and fire-fighting water supply and system capacity for the growing community. Program areas include operations and maintenance, water quality monitoring, cross-connection control, groundwater protection, water conservation, water treatment, water source and other capital facility development, and reclaimed water. The division functions with 34 FTEs on a budget of \$16.3 million.

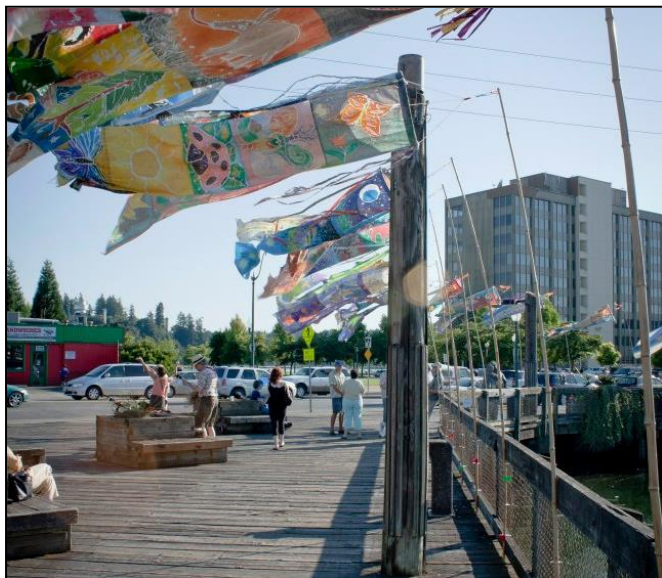
THE POSITION

Under the direction of the Public Works Director, the Drinking Water Utility Director will plan, organize, supervise, and direct all activities of the Drinking Water Utility. The new Director will lead the planning, design, and operation/maintenance of the Drinking Water Utility consistent with state and federal regulations, as well as the vision and direction contained in the City's Comprehensive Plan and Water System Plan. THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

Education and Experience:

The ideal candidate will have graduated from an accredited college or university with a four-year degree in Public Administration, Planning, Engineering, or other fields closely related to drinking water and water resources, and have four (4) years of progressively responsible experience in the management of drinking water utility projects, programs, and activities, including at least two (2) years of supervisory experience. Additional qualifying experience may be substituted for the required education on a year-for-year basis. Experience with a municipality or other public sector utility experience is preferred. Candidates must possess a valid Washington State Driver's License by the time of hire. A State of Washington Professional Engineer License is desired but not required.



Necessary Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Skill managing infrastructure maintenance and staff.
 - Ability to maintain a balanced utility rate structure.
 - Municipal utility and financial management experience.
 - Ability to develop a collaborative culture and be a team builder, effective leader and coach.
 - The ideal candidate will be self-confident without the need to command from position authority.
 - Ability to lead with the values of the City of Olympia.
- Ability to respond to and respect a civically engaged population.
